
Announcement: Currently, the Grants Management Training for Faculty <u>Program</u> consists of a single course that covers fiscal-administrative issues related to grants management. Effective **July 1, 2016**, the program will be expanded to include an additional series of four individual lessons (totaling approximately one hour in duration) developed by the <u>Office of Compliance</u>. The topics for the new lessons cover issues related to research ethics and include:

- Conflict of Interest
- Research Misconduct
- Data Sharing and Management
- Authorship and Attribution, Peer Review, and Mentoring

The program (totaling 3 hours) is required for all faculty prior to the award of their first sponsored research project as well as non-faculty designated as a named Principal Investigator/Program Director (PI/PD), Co-PI, or a Multi-PI, prior to the award of their first sponsored research project. Faculty who have completed the program previously <u>do not</u> need to take the training again.
