**UPDATE:** On Friday, May 12, 2017, the [Grants Management Training for Faculty](#) program will be updated within Trojan Learn to include a more informative layout and breakdown of course content. Instead of a single 2-hour Fiscal Administration module, the course has been separated into four smaller 30-minute modules. All of the course content as well as the total duration of the program will remain the same. All faculty who register for the program on/after May 12, 2017 will have access to the latest version of the program.

As a reminder, the Grants Management Training for Faculty program is required for all faculty prior to the award of their first sponsored research project as well as non-faculty designated as a named Principal Investigator/Program Director (PI/PD), Co-PI, or a Multi-PI, prior to the award of their first sponsored research project. Investigators have until the time their grant is awarded to complete the training. If the grant is awarded and the program has not been completed, the award will not be processed or an account identified for funding. We suggest completing the program as early as possible to avoid any delays in award processing.
